- New Linux Users Group (NEWLINUX) meetings are for newcomers to Linux.
 - Fourth Tuesday of each month (usually).
 - ★ Free format, focused on questions from the newest Linux users.
- NEWLINUX was founded as a Special Interest Group (SIG) of SLUUG.
 - Because the usual STLLINUX meetings seldom focused on very new Linux users.
 - Originally named as Hazelwood Linux Users Group.
- The New Linux Users Group (NEWLINUX) is supported by SLUUG email and web.
- Remote sessions run from **6:00pm** to **9:00pm**. Actual meeting starts at **6:30pm**.
- All of our meetings are free and open to the public.
- There is no individual membership fee.
